

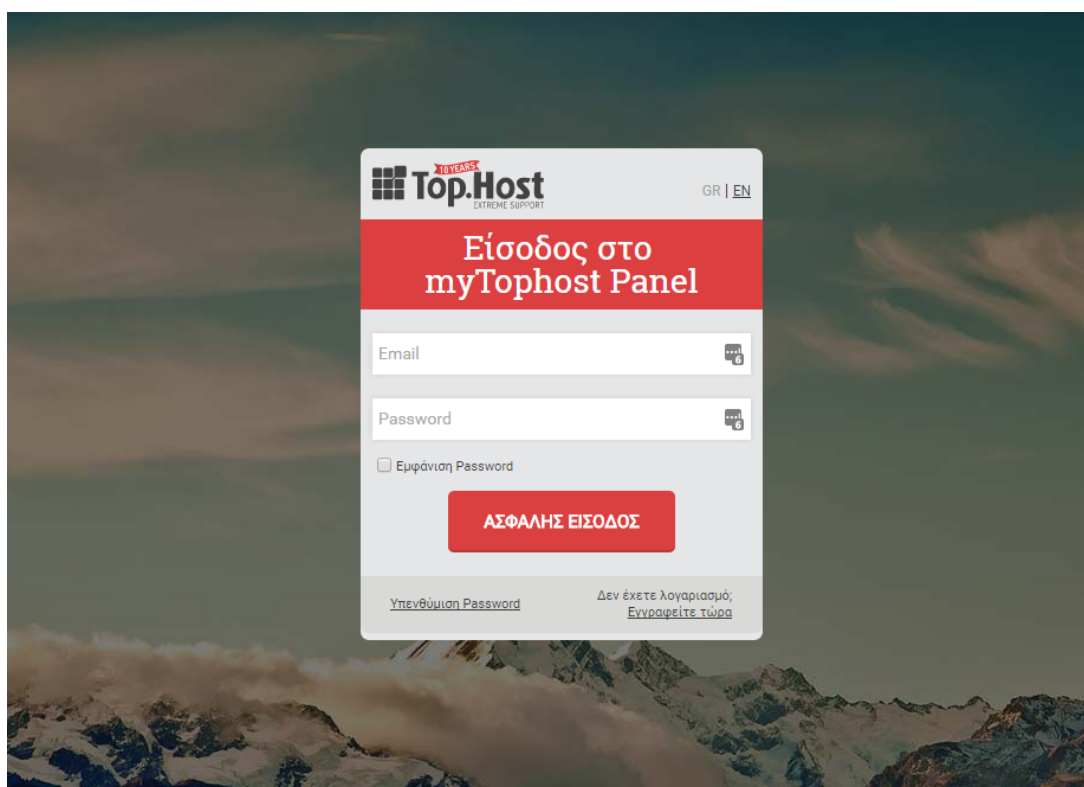

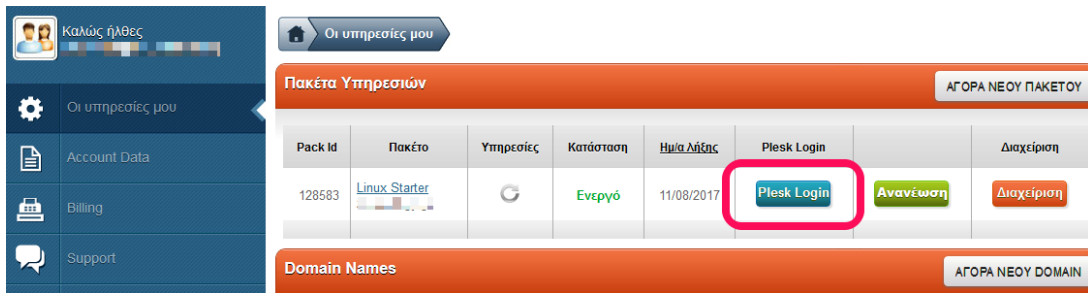
How can I enable a Password Protected Directory in Plesk Onyx?

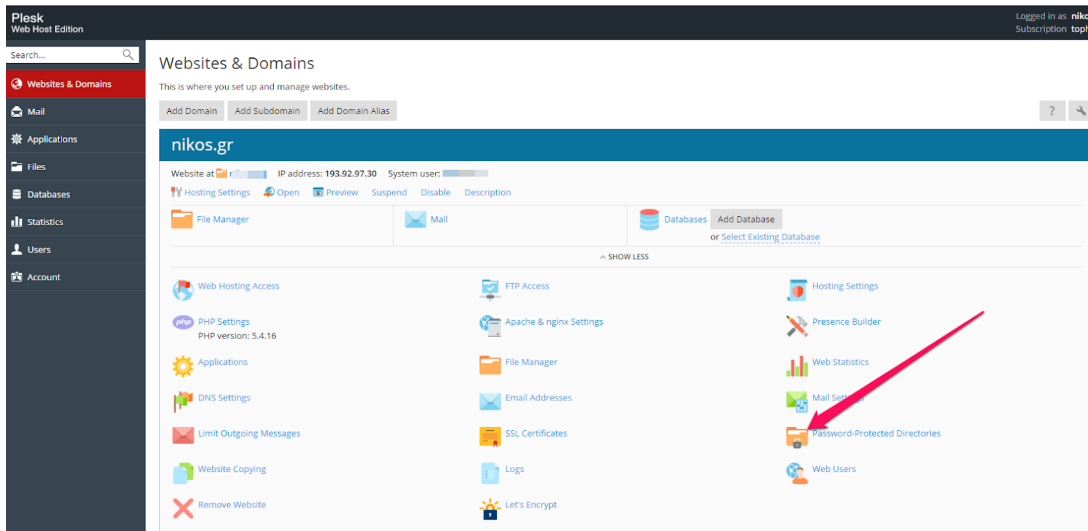
In order to enable a **Password Protected Directory** in Plesk, follow the instructions below.

1. Log into [myTophost Panel](#) and then select **Plesk Login** in order to connect to the Plesk of the plan that you are interested in.

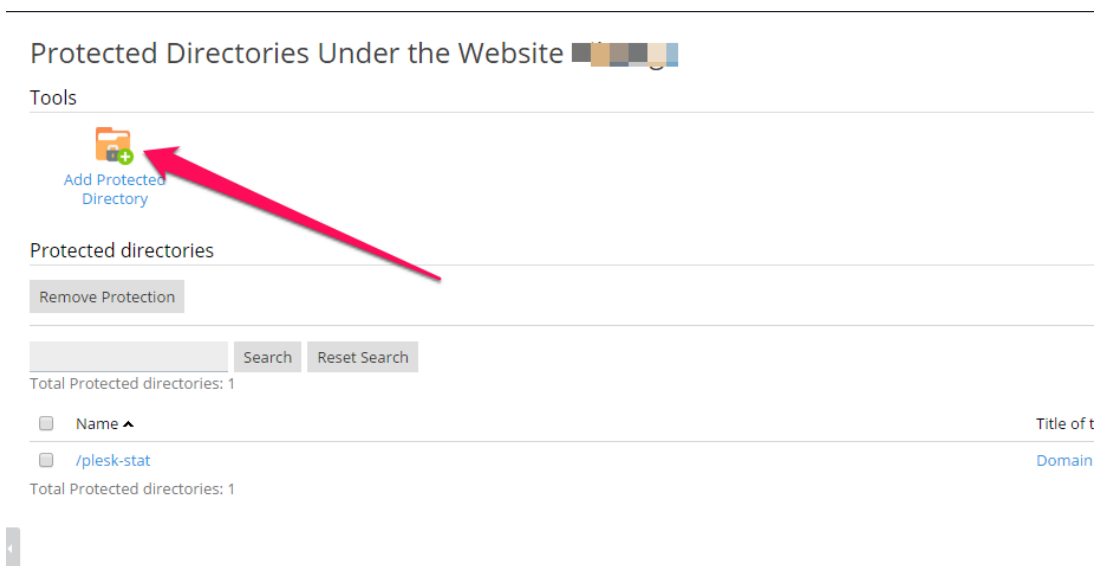




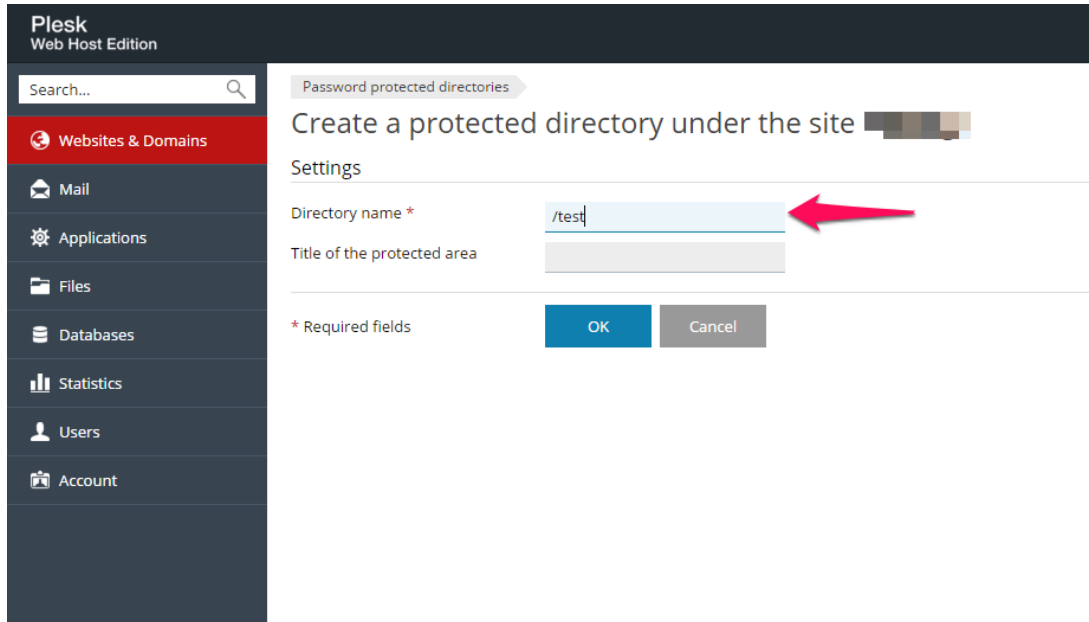
2. In the tab **Websites & Domains** select **Password Protected Directories**.



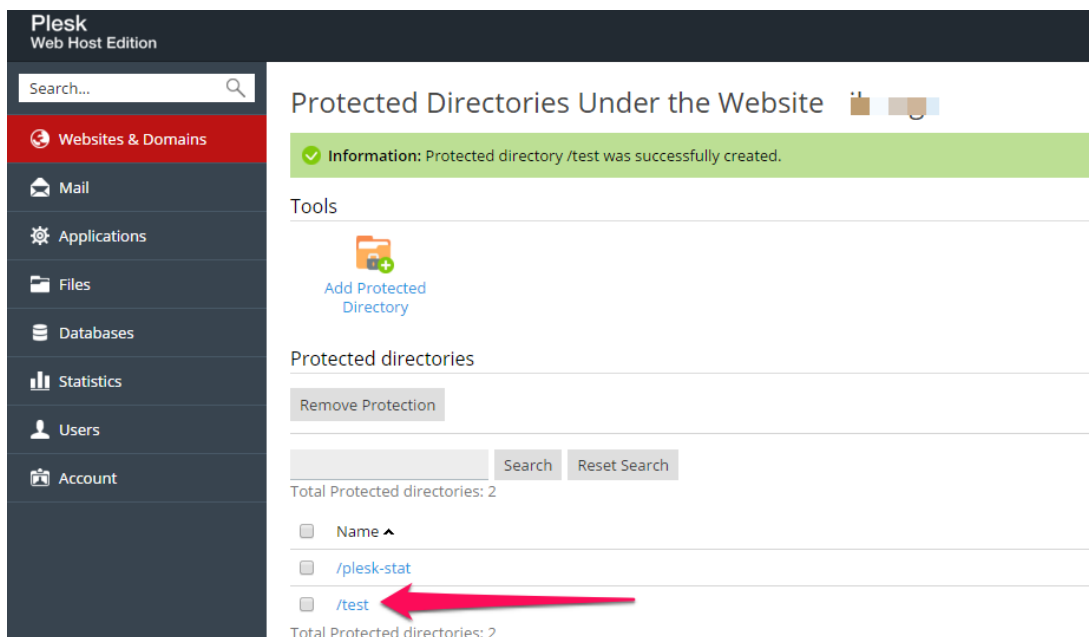
3. Click on **Add Protected Directory**.



4. In **Directory Name**, enter a name for your directory. Leave Title of the protected area blank since it's not mandatory. In our example, we put "test".



5. Select the **protected directory that you created** and add a new user (username / password) by clicking on **Add New User**.



6. **Enter a Username and Password** so that the user can log in with this information,

when they type the Protected Directory.
